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Abstract (Times New Roman, bold, 12 pt, Centred, no numbering)

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The Abstract paragraph (summarising the full paper) should not exceed 100 words (Times
New Roman, 12 pt, justified)

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Keywords (Times New Roman, bold, 12 pt, Centred, no numbering)

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Keyword 1, Keyword 2, Keyword 3, Keyword 4 (up to four keywords) (Times New Roman,
12 pt, justified)

General instructions on main subject text (Section main headings such as Introduction, Literature, Methodology, Findings, Discussion, Conclusion: Times New Roman, bold, 12 pt, no numbering)

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Body of text (Times New Roman, 12 pt, justified). Page margins should be as follows: top 2.54 cm, bottom 2.54 cm, left and right 2.54 cm each. One line spacing should be provided between the paragraphs. The overall length of the paper, including all illustrations, tables, and references, is limited to 12 pages. Papers exceeding this limit will be returned to the corresponding author.

Pages should be numbered in the page footer, including the first page, as demonstrated in this document. Papers should be organized in the following sequence:

- Title of the paper, name(s) of the author(s), affiliation(s)
- Abstract
- Keywords
- Main subject text
- Acknowledgments (if applicable)
- References

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Body of text (Times New Roman, 12 pt, justified)

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Second Subsection headings (Times New Roman, italic, 12 pt, no numbering)

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Body of text (Times New Roman, 12 pt, justified)

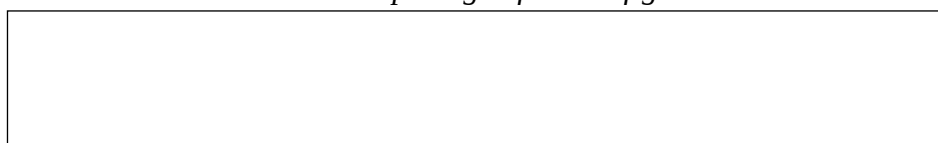


Figure 1 – Caption (Times New Roman, Italic, 12 pt, centred)

For chapters in edited books: Surname, Initials (Year), "Title", in Editor's Name, Initials (Ed.), *Title*, Publisher, Place, Pages.

For articles: Surname, Initials (Year), "Title", *Journal Name*, Volume, Number, Pages.
